

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

Today, April 27th is Divine Mercy Sunday, a beautiful opportunity for us to celebrate the Mercy of Our Savior, Jesus Christ. In the 1930's, Jesus appeared to St. Faustina Kowalska and revealed the message of Mercy to her for



the Church and world, and in 2000, Pope St John Paul II declared the Sunday after Easter to be the Feast of Mercy.

In honor of that special day, we will be having a Divine Mercy service at St Anthony's in Cortland at 3 PM on Sunday, April 27th. The service will include adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, sung Chaplet of Divine Mercy, homily, benediction and will conclude with the celebration of the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Before the service, Confessions will be available from 2-2:45 PM. All are welcome!!

Please Join Us In Reading Interior Freedom by Fr Jacques Philippe

Join us for 7 consecutive Tuesday evenings in reading and discussing the book *Interior Freedom*, by Fr. Jacques Philippe! We will meet at the Parish Center at 6:30 PM starting Tuesday, April 29th and concluding on June 10th. *Interior Freedom* is a short but powerful book - from the back cover:

"Despite the most difficult situations that can restrain our physical movement, each person has deep inside a place of freedom that no external power can take away, because God Himself is its source. A person wins inner freedom to the extent that he connects to its source - God Himself - by practicing the virtues of faith, hope and charity. These theological virtues are the center of the spiritual life. As the basis for interior growth, they become the source of the glorious freedom of the children of God. Written in a simple and inviting style, this book seeks to liberate the heart and mind to enable it to live the true freedom to which God calls each one." Copies of the book are free, but please RSVP as soon as possible so the books may be ordered and given out in advance of the first meeting on Tuesday, April 29th to make the most use of our time together.

Divine Mercy Sunday History:

Divine Mercy Sunday is an Observance in the Roman Catholic Church in which followers are encouraged to offer forgiveness and reconciliation to all. It is based on visions recorded from St. Faustina Kowalski. In 2000, it was

decreed a solemnity, a high feast day, by Pope John Paul II. Roman Catholics are required to attend worship, go to confession, and take Holy Communion. Divine Mercy Sunday occurs the Sunday after Easter.

Divine Mercy Sunday Facts & Ouotes:

- St. Faustina was a Polish nun who lived in the early 20th century. She devoted her life to spreading the word about God's forgiveness, or divine mercy, for anyone who asks for forgiveness. Although she was a mystic, she also cooked and gardened as part of her convent life.
- St. Faustina had visions much of her life. One that was the most profound was of Jesus, with one hand raised in blessing and with two fingers of his other hand resting on his heart. She said that Jesus asked her to have the image painted, and to include a prayer that said, "Jesus, I trust in you." This is the prayer that Catholics recite on Divine Mercy Sunday.
- Most priests preach on the story of Doubting Thomas on Divine Mercy Sunday (John 20:19-31). Thomas, also a saint in the Roman Catholic Church, was one of the Jesus' apostles. Jesus arose from the dead, he didn't believe it. Jesus directed him to touch his crucifixion wounds to help him believe. Jesus doesn't chastise Thomas for his disbelief, which is considered an act of mercy.
- The Message of Divine Mercy has always been near and dear to me ... which I took with me to the Sea of Peter and which it in a sense forms the image of this Pontificate. - Pope John Paul II

Sacrament of Baptism: Baptisms are normally celebrated after a weekend Mass. Please contact the Parish Center for information regarding the preparation class and to schedule.

Faith Formation: The education of our children in the lifegiving truths of our Faith is the heart of our mission as a parish. St Mary's School accepts children in pre-K through grade 6. Children enrolled in the public schools grades K-10 attend Religious Education classes at their respective parishes on Sunday mornings. Students in High School attend Confirmation classes.

Marriage Preparation: Marriage arrangements should be made at least 6 months in advance by calling the parish office for an appointment. Pre-Cana attendance is required.

Anointing and Visits to the Sick: Please notify the Parish Center of a family member's admission to a hospital or nursing care facility, or of confinement at home to arrange for spiritual care, Holy Communion and/or Anointing of the Sick. The Mass from St Mary's is televised on cable channel 2 at 10 AM on Sunday mornings.

Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA): Are you interested in becoming a Catholic? OCIA (formerly called RCIA) is a process for becoming a fully initiated member of the Catholic Faith. It is for those who are seeking Baptism in the Catholic Faith, those who have been baptized in another Christian tradition and now seek to be a member of the Catholic Faith, and for those who have been baptized Catholic but have not received the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist.
